


Africa House is situated in the exclusive, 645-hectare Hoedspruit Wildlife Estate in the Lowveld of South Africa.

## Accommodation & Facilities



A famous Lowveld leopard of the Sabi Sands who was known around the world not only by visitors to the Sabi Sands but also from the live safari show Wild Farth.




















### Our Rooms

### Furniture

The furniture in the lodge is almost exclusively made from African hard woods that have been responsibly and sustainably harvested. Referred to as Campaign furniture, it owes its look and feel to furniture which originated in the 1740s in the British Empire when gentlemen sought out light, compact, foldable and comfortable furniture for their next campaign or exploration.





















### Location

The Lowveld is a prime area for enjoying life to the fullest, beautiful vistas of the Klein Drakensberg mountains, the world-renowned Kruger National Park, surrounded by a multitude of top-class private nature reserves, and a wide selection of action/adventure activities, all close to the delightfully quaint town of Hoedspruit.

Africa house is located in the premier Hoedspruit Wildlife Estate. An accurate way to describe Hoedspruit would be as the Safari Capital of South Africa.

Hoedspruit is nestled between the imposing Drakensberg mountains to the west and to the east lies vast expanses of bush, home to the world-renowned Kruger National Park and a plethora of first-class private nature reserves.





About the Hoedspruit Estate and nearby amenities

You get the best of both worlds when you stay at Africa House – the bush experience on your doorstep, together with nearby amenities when you want a slight change of scenery.

Since Hoedspruit Wildlife Estate is a secure estate encompassing about 645 hectares with a wonderful greenbelt teeming with plains game, it's completely safe for walking, jogging and cycling.

The estate is serviced by a tarred road network with optional tracks for gamedrives, and horseriding. The estate has two dams and accompanying bird hides.

However, should you wish to experience the Big 5, there are several excellent game reserves such as the Kruger National Park, Sabi Sands, Kapama within close driving distance.

Guided tours of these as well as the Moholoholo Specialised Animal Rehabilitation Centre can be arranged.

# Travel Information

## The Climate

In South Africa there are a number of climates:

- The cool and arid climate of the west coast (Namib desert).
- The subtropical climate of the southern coast, with Mediterranean characteristics, that is, with a dry summer, in the westernmost part (as in Cape Town), while there is no dry season in the eastern part (as in Durban).
- The climate of the plateau (where Africa House is situated), which covers most of the country, with dry, sunny winters (during which it can get cold at night), and hot summers (during which thunderstorms can break out). The plateau is more arid in the western part, where there is a desert, than in the eastern part, where there are several cities including Johannesburg and Pretoria.

Winter (May-August) at Africa House is a lovely time to visit with temperatures that vary from 3°C (38°F) at night to 23°C (73°F). Share our wonderful temperate days, with cool evenings and mornings.

Summer temperatures (September to April) vary from 25°C (77°F) to a steaming hot 40°C (104°F) and somewhat humid conditions. Average annual temperature at the lodge is 25°C (77°F), humidity is about 52%, with a UV index of 5. Over 60% of the year is dry, with an average rainfall of 353 mm experienced annually.

Wildlife viewing is best during the winter months, May to August, and into early October. Weather is pleasant and cool, the grass is shorter and the bush is not so dense. Also, as an added benefit, mosquitoes are absent.



#### What to wear?

Light summer clothes are ideal for the hotter days, with a sweater or jacket for the cooler evenings. Warmer clothes are required during the winter months, especially at night and during game drives (it becomes bitterly cold on the back of an open safari vehicle), at dawn and dusk. Neutral coloured clothing is preferable for game drives and walks.

Remember to pack a sunhat, sunglasses, sunscreen, swimwear, comfortable walking shoes/boots, insect repellent, rainproof jacket, binoculars and a camera.


#### Travel documents needed

Depending on your country of residence, you may require a VISA. Please enquire at your local embassy or online. Bring your passport or ID book as proof of identity.

#### Medical

While the Hoedspruit area carries a low risk of malaria, your risk increases as you travel into Kruger Park's northernmost areas. Please consult your local travel clinic for appropriate prophylactic medication.

Hoedspruit is well serviced by multiple general practitioners. The closest major hospitals are Tzaneen and further away, Nelspruit.
